ADMISSIONS CHECKLIST

In order to register for classes you must first complete the application process. Upon completion of Step 1 you will receive an acceptance E-mail and details on how to schedule an NSR (New Student Registration).

- 1. Complete the Application Process.** You will need to apply online at CTState.edu\Apply, and submit the required documents by uploading them during the application process. You will receive an E-mail acknowledgement when your application has been processed.

Supporting documents for new students:

- _____ **Proof that you are currently in high school:** Copy of current high school transcript. We will also need your high school to send us your final Transcript, once you have graduated. You can let your school know to send your transcript to us in School Links (also required to receive financial aid).
- _____ **Immunization requirements:** All degree seeking students are required by state law to submit immunization documentation for 2 doses of Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR) and 2 doses of Varicella (Chicken Pox). Documentation is usually available from the school nurse or your Doctor's office.
- _____ **College transcripts:** If you took an AP class or a class at your local college have an official Transcript sent to NVCC so you can receive credit for these classes.
- _____ **SAT or ACT test scores:** Submit scores to waive testing and determine Math and English placement.
Minimum scores:
SAT: 530 in Math, 480 in Evidenced Based Reading/Writing or 26 in Written Language, or 25 in Reading.
ACT: 18 in Math and/or 21 in English, or 47 in English and Reading combined.

- 2. Apply NOW For Financial Aid!!! (Required only if you are seeking financial assistance).** Go to www.fafsa.ed.gov to obtain information and apply for financial aid. CT State Community College code is 007635. FAFSA is required to participate in PACT, Connecticut's Free College Program for more info go to ct.edu/pact
- 3. Schedule an NSR Session (New Student Registration).** You will receive an E-Mail once the registration period is open and you can register. During this meeting you will be advised on what classes you need to take for the degree you have chosen to pursue.
- 4. Register for Classes.** After you have met with an advisor and you have confirmed that you want to be registered for the classes on your advising sheet. The advisor you have been working with will register you for classes and send you a confirmation E-Mail letting you know you have been registered.
- 5. Pay your Tuition.** A payment is due at time of registration. We accept cash, checks, and credits cards including VISA, MasterCard or Discover. A payment plan is also available. Students who have received a financial aid award may not need to make a payment. These students should discuss payment responsibilities with the financial aid staff.
